- Finish pruning rose bushes
- Cut back stalks of ornamental grasses to within a few inches of the ground to make room for new growth
- Switch from spray sprinklers to line drip in preparation for the upcoming drought
- Check out grass substitutes like California dune sage, South African silver carbet or Kurapia instead of plastic ground covers
- Plant more cauliflower, broccoli, kale and other cabbage family cool season plants
- Start planting beans
- Prune grape leaves
- Plant bare root fruit trees, blueberries and strawberries
- Fertilize citrus and avocado trees
