

- Buy fruit trees & plant ASAP. Use worm castings & natural soil. Irrigate by drip 10" from the tree.
- Prune deciduous trees.
- Fertilize fruit trees.
- Plant deciduous ornamentals.
- Plant ornamental perennials and shrubs.
- Leave the leaves on the ground to keep down

weeds , hold water, and fertilize the soil.

- Check mulch and add where needed.
- Check irrigation for leaks. Check spray heads to see if they are aimed correctly.
- Propagate succulents.
- Relish the experience of beginning of a new growing season.
