


Companion planting

Her talk at our meeting this month will address companion planting and crop rotation. Both these techniques maximize the productivity of your garden, help increase yield, manage pests in an organic manner, and increase soil nutrients.



Companion planting involves planting certain vegetables together to improve yields and soil. Crop rotation is the practice of growing a series of different vegetables in the same area across a sequence of growing seasons.

February Garden Chores



- ♦ Clean out the veggie garden. Remove all dead plants and weeds.
- Test soil and use appropriate fertilizer to meet your soil's needs.
- ♦ Top beds with compost.
- Start tomato seeds indoors if chill continues or plant outdoors if weather allows.
- ♦ Prune roses.
- ♦ Plant cool season veggies like carrots, peas, and beets.
- **♦ Check shrubs before trimming. Look for nesting birds.**

A Tip for Growing More and Bigger Tomatoes



Add 1tsp of Epsom salts to 5 cups warm water in spay bottle. Spray plants from first sign of blooms and once monthly.

Add 1tsp of Epsom salts to bottom of each hole before planting seeds for faster germination. Works for peppers too.
