#### Brydon's meadow makes an encore bloom

Last year towards the end of the blooming season, Brydon Bennett hosted the garden club for a look at his annual meadow project.

This year Brydon chose not to seed fresh but to rely on what returned from last year. He had to do a lot of weeding early on or else the flowers would have been smothered. However, in reward for his weeding efforts most species have reappeared (approx. 20) but in different proportions, the crimson clover (*Trifolium incarnatum*) being much more abundant than before.

- Plant for summer color
- Plant fall-flowering bulbs
- Feed and water cacti or succulents that are blooming or actively growing
- Spray for peach leaf curl, peach leaf blight, and canker
- Feed houseplants that are growing or blooming
- Repair or plant lawns
- Prune spring-flowering shrubs and vines during or just after bloom
- Sow seeds for warm-season vegetables
- Transplant warm-season vegetable seedlings
