- Cut back tomato plants to encourage fall production

• Are you trying to grow giant <u>pumpkins</u>? Pay close attention to them this month. When you see other fruits begin to develop or female blossoms, be sure to remove them. By removing either the fruits or female blossoms, it's encouraging the plant to put its energy into the fruit already growing instead of producing more.

Gardeners, we are a special group who are generous, curious, and delight in learning.


# Minutes from the July 25th Meeting
