

March Garden Chores



- Test your garden soil to see what its chemical needs are
- Plant herbs
- Prune citrus trees and plant new ones
- Fertilize roses
- Prune spring flowering plants only after blooming
- Finish planting cool season veggies
- Toward the end of the month plant summer season veggies
- · Fertilize deciduous fruit trees when they leaf out
- As trees begin to bear fruit, thin the fruit to 6" apart so they can grow larger
- Feed camellias
- Mulch

Plant a Tree and get up to \$50

SDG&E is offering up to \$50 to gardeners who plant a new tree in the ground or in a pot on their property.

How It Works

Qualifying SDG&E customers can receive a \$25 rebate for planting or potting a 1-gallon tree, \$35 rebate for a 5-gallon tree and a \$50 rebate for a 15-gallon tree. Customers can apply for up to five (5) rebates annually. Customers do not need a yard to qualify, as trees can be planted in large containers on outdoor balconies or patio areas.
